# Chairperson's Report

**Despite continued economic woes, 2009 saw an increase in the number of donor funds at The Foundation and a 34.5% increase in grant-making. Indeed, we were one of the very few grant-making organisations in Ireland to record an increase which brought to over €6.3million the cumulative value of grants to date. Donors who want to engage in more strategic, planned giving increasingly appreciate and understand the expertise we bring to the table.**

In 2009 we were able to channel over 600 grants worth €1.32million, from donor funds to community and voluntary groups and charities around the country and also, but to a lesser extent, overseas. The Community Foundation has very purposefully sought to build an endowment and while values came under pressure in 2008, it stabilised in 2009 and continued to generate income to facilitate continued grant-making. The permanent endowed funds totalled more than €25.3 million at year end. We must say a BIG THANK YOU again for the generosity of individuals, families and companies across Ireland who established their charitable funds with us. They are only part of the picture however as it is the work of local community groups and charities that inspires this giving.

Philanthropy is still at its early stages in Ireland and The Community Foundation is strongly promoting and raising awareness of philanthropy. The Philanthropist of the Year Awards are designed to publicly recognise the contributions of donors, their leadership on these issues as well as the value of philanthropy generally for our society. The County Monaghan Fund continued to develop under the chairmanship of Cathal McCarthy. During the year a significant new spend down family fund was among the new donor advised funds established at The Foundation.

Our workload with **professional advisors** increased in 2009. Advisors are positioned to advise their clients on giving options. The Community Foundation established a new dedicated sub-committee of the board made up of advisors from a number of disciplines including law, accounting, tax and wealth management. The advisor update is now sent by email to a database of over 2,000 professional advisors across Ireland.

We organised four **philanthropy seminars** during 2009 for donors, advisors and charities. One of our donors spoke of his philanthropy motivations and journey to date at an event for

advisors hosted by McCann FitzGerald. At this event we also heard of the experience of donors at a community foundation in Ottawa, Canada. Hosted by AIB, we held our first professional advisor event in Cork. We also held a joint professional advisor event with Philanthropy Ireland featuring Charles A Lowenhaupt from the USA which was aptly titled 'Sound Principles of Private Wealth Management'. Attendees at another event, hosted by HSBC and run in conjunction with the European Association of Philanthropy and Giving, heard from Paul Knox, Head of UK Wealth Advisory at JP Morgan about the increasing role of advisors in philanthropy.

In April we were delighted to welcome back former board members including former chairs John Gallagher and Chris Horn for an Emeritus board meeting. We were also very pleased that Louis FitzGerald joined the board. Under the stewardship of Anna Lee, the Grants Assessment Panel continued to ensure our grant making policies and processes were rigorous, transparent and effective. Our Finance, Administration, Investment and Governance Committee, led by Harry Byrne, continued its sterling work, during what was a turbulent year for anyone in finance or investment. John Rockett and the advisory panel of professional advisors are helping The Community Foundation increase awareness levels of philanthropy to those in the legal and financial worlds. An Asset Development sub-committee was established during the year comprised of Barry Connolly and Louis FitzGerald from our board.

I would like to say that it is a pleasure being associated with the The Community Foundation. I always come out of our meetings invigorated as they focus on the positive, what can happen, what is being done, what can we do... Finally, I would like to thank fellow members of the Board and all the staff of The Community Foundation for Ireland for this continued commitment and enthusiasm around the work.

# Chief Executive's Review

Philanthropy and the value of a strong Community Foundation for Ireland became even more apparent as the recession deepened and government funding has come under pressure.

**Our purpose – to connect donors with strategic social projects around Ireland – made significant strides this year with increases in funds invested and in grants awarded. Overall, in 2009, the Foundation awarded grants on behalf of donors totalling €1.325 million. This included €471,604 from the Grassroots Grants Programme (formerly known as the Small Grants Programme) which is derived from the interest earnings of our Endowment Fund for Ireland and which supported 412 community projects - in almost every county in the Republic of Ireland. The criteria were amended during the year to refocus on smaller organisations with a turnover of €250k or less. Issues such as families at risk, older people, ethnic minorities, carers, mental health and sexual minorities were addressed.**

Our main funding programme continued to be oversubscribed, though not as much as in late 2008. In 2009 grants rounds were typically oversubscribed by 8:1, still indicating a serious need for funds among the groups we support.

The **Ray Murphy Fund**, focussing on grants to build leadership within the community sector entered its second year. It will run until 2017. A memorial fund, it proved to be of huge value to the community sector at a time when strong leadership capacity became more important than ever.

The **OLC Ireland Trust Fund**, managed by The Community Foundation for Ireland on behalf of The Sisters of Our Lady of Charity was launched in January. The Fund supports projects that most closely respond to issues concerning addictions, prostitution, trafficking, violence and abuse of women. By year end it had already made 30 grants valued at almost **€95,000**.

Much of Ireland's wealth was decimated in 2009 as property prices plummeted. There are still many smart business people in Ireland and I personally remain optimistic for the future of Ireland and the future of philanthropy here. For example, during 2009, a **new €900k family spend down fund** was established. Endowment values rebounded somewhat as stock markets worldwide recovered though they remained volatile. The Community Foundation generated a good return of 4% and the value of investments rose by 6.5%.

The **Flood Recovery Fund** was set up in November 2009 following the widespread flooding that wreaked havoc in so many places in Ireland. There was a generous response from companies and the people of Ireland to the Fund. It raised more than **€180,000**. It has supported initial emergency responses, remedial and latterly more strategic projects.

In 2009 The Foundation continued to focus on **professional advisors** – lawyers, tax advisors, accountants and wealth managers. Community foundations around the world work closely with such advisors and it is a win-win for both parties when clients establish successful funds at their community foundations. These activities were supported by the publication of the quarterly newsletters by The Foundation. Addressed at donors and advisors respectively, they were complemented by a significant increase in our print and broadcast media communications.

The Community Foundation has developed a strong reputation for its **Philanthropy Seminar series**. These are aimed at stimulating philanthropy in Ireland and focussed at successful individuals and families and professional advisors.

Too often we hear that there are no philanthropy role models in Ireland or that the Irish don't talk about their giving. The Community Foundation established the **Philanthropist of the Year Awards** in 2007 to recognise and

honour individuals who have shown exceptional generosity and commitment to support charities and voluntary organisations both here in Ireland and abroad. The 2008 winners were showcased on RTE's Nationwide programme in September. The 2009 Philanthropist of the Year Award winners were Chantal McCabe, the founder of Social Innovations Ireland and subsequently the Immigrant Council and Young Social Innovators who was awarded National Philanthropist of the Year; John Clarke, founder and director of Friends in Ireland who was awarded International Philanthropist of the Year and Cathal McCarthy, a Monaghan native who has made an outstanding contribution to his local community, he was awarded Local Philanthropist of the Year.

Each winner is an example of how individuals can have a major impact on people's lives. They are strategic and business-minded in their approach to tackling an issue. This type of attitude is what distinguishes philanthropy from charity, the vision and determination to achieve long term changes, even in these adverse times. We look forward to more great winners in the years ahead.

The **County Monaghan Fund** continued to make some fantastic grants in 2009. The fund is a wonderful example of how the pooling of resources by many people can make an impact in a meaningful and strategic manner. It supported scholarships for young people from the county to access third level education at DCU. Congratulations (again) to Chair Cathal McCarthy on being named Monaghan Person of the Year 2009. His vibrant committee did great work also and Seamus McDermott continues to work with the committee to build the Fund.

The **Strategic Grants Programme** is in its second year. We could do so much in this area

to support organisations with larger multi-annual grants if funds permitted, but we are happy with the progress being made. A grant of €250,000 over a three period was committed in 2008 to GLEN for a project to establish a helpline and website. Progress has been dramatic and we are looking forward to great outcomes in 2010.

I would like to thank Atlantic Philanthropies, Philanthropy Ireland and the range of professional advisors that we have worked with during 2009 to advance the development of philanthropy in Ireland. Transatlantic ties through the TCFN Peer Exchange continued when they supported a training visit hosted by us in Dublin. Community foundation leaders from 10 other foundations from the United States, Canada, Belgium, Poland, Scotland and England attended.

Finally, I would like to thank the Board and the staff of The Community Foundation for Ireland for their ongoing effort and passion.

# About The Community Foundation for Ireland

**The Community Foundation for Ireland makes grants on behalf of donors. We connect individuals, families, companies and other organisations to the most deserving and effective local grassroots causes.**

When donors give monies to The Community Foundation, it is not the object of their charitable intentions, rather the vehicle. By providing a service for donors, they can be more strategic, more impactful and we hope, they can enjoy their philanthropy more.

Ireland has over 20,000 community, voluntary and charitable organisations and it can be difficult to choose which organisations to help in order to support a local community. The Community Foundation provides a mechanism to support local groups where a small amount of money can make a big impact on their work.

With a minimum of bureaucracy, donors and the community get maximum return on their charitable investment. We also work with a small but increasing number of donors who wish to support projects and charities overseas.

# About The Community Foundation for Ireland

The Community Foundation for Ireland has four very important sub-committees, each focused on a clear agenda.

## Performance

2009 saw a return to positive returns. A further €756,248 representing donations received from donors went into the Fund. The Fund also received investment income during the year (including tax reclaimed) of €894,854. €975,663 was made available to the Foundation to meet its grant making requirements and to cover its administrative costs. During the year, the fund realised losses of €1,191,527 but this was more than offset by unrealised gains of €2,712,608, resulting in a total capital appreciation of €1,521,081 during the year.

# Grant Making

The Community Foundation provides an innovative mechanism for grant making. The Foundation finds and links donors with causes and projects of interest to them. Working closely with the donors and knowledge of the sectors informs this grant-making.

The Community Foundation generally makes grants from three areas:

1. Grants from Corporate Funds: Grants are disbursed on the basis of invited applications from the particular thematic causes or social groups identified by the donor. Employees are often involved in helping to decide which projects to be supported.
2. Grants from Donor-Advised Individual or Family Endowment Funds: Grants are made into areas the donors wish to support such as medical research or for specific geographic areas.
3. Funds where the Board has complete discretion over the grant-making. The Small Grants Programme is one such example. Grants are made from interest earned on donations that are pooled in the Endowment Fund for Ireland. These donations were made over a period of years (and continue to be made) as unrestricted funds for grant making purposes which are left to the discretion of the Board. The new Strategic Grants Programme and the Ray Murphy Fund are also in this category.

## Grassroots Grants Programme

During 2009, the Board made a decision to allocate additional funding for small grants through the Grassroots Grants Programme. As a result, grant-making increased by 36% from €342k in 2008 to €465k. The level of demand in 2009 reduced slightly as a result of amendments to the criteria, but still remained very high compared to pre-recessionary times. The programme was approximately eight times over-subscribed during the year.

Applications, which are reviewed by an independent Grants Expert Panel, are welcome in three rounds per annum.

Applications must address one of six broadly-defined topics:

### 1. CARERS

Support for carers including actions such as the development of social networks, local respite initiatives.

### 2. OLDER PEOPLE

3 key areas: Outreach schemes which assist older people to join social groups and networks in their community. Projects promoting social contact for older isolated men. Groups working with older people through visitation/phone services.

### 3. FAMILIES AT RISK

Aimed at very vulnerable children. Indicators include substance misuse issues in the family setting, if they are in receipt of social work services, or in consistent poverty.

### 4. SEXUAL MINORITIES

Supports for sexual minorities, especially outreach projects to LGBT ethnic minorities and those in rural areas.

### 5. ETHNIC MINORITIES

Assisting the building of networks and structures for ethnic minorities, with a particular emphasis on Integration.

### 6. MENTAL HEALTH AND INTEGRATION

Community integration and supports for people who have had recent mental health difficulties.

### The Ray Murphy Fund,

established in honour of the long-time philanthropy advocate was established in 2008 and has proven to be a very timely fund. At a time when resources are decreasing, leadership within the third sector is critical. This fund supported six organisation leaders in 2009.

Application criteria are also available online.


