In the first decade of The Community Foundation for Ireland, we witnessed the booming Celtic tiger economy in the earlier years, followed by the current severe economic recession. The squirrel which appears throughout this report is a metaphor for our core belief in planning ahead and growing an endowment fund in Ireland for the future. After only ten years in existence, The Community Foundation for Ireland's Endowment Fund is approaching €27m in value. By setting aside and investing funds for the future, we are providing sustainable funding for the years to come and ensuring that the Foundation is itself self reliant and independent.

In the past ten years we have seen the importance of prudent management of funds, the power of people to inspire and assist others in good and bad times and the resilience and resourcefulness of the community and voluntary sector.

Through its endowment and the ever increasing group of donors who choose The Community Foundation as the custodian for their giving, The Community Foundation has been able to increase its grant-making in the past three years of recession. Grants in excess of €4.5m have been given to over 1750 community and voluntary groups throughout Ireland, demonstrating that the community foundation model works - in good times and bad.

Notwithstanding the really difficult economic climate, 2010 was a good year for The Community Foundation for Ireland. 14 new funds were set up in 2010 and by the year end there were over 50 funds at The Community Foundation. During 2010, The Community Foundation distributed €2.175m in a variety of grants ranging from its core Grassroots Grants through to thematic grants (e.g. through the Women's Fund and the LGBT Fund) and larger Impact Grants. Amongst the year's highlights were a symposium in April on "Realising the Power and Potential of Women in Philanthropy", which was addressed by our Patron, The

President, Mary McAleese, to coincide with the launch of the Women's Fund by The Community Foundation. 2010 saw the ongoing development of the County Monaghan Fund and The Community Foundation also launched ground breaking research on legacies in Ireland.

This report celebrates the first 10 years of The Community Foundation for Ireland, as well as presenting our annual report for 2010. So many people have helped us on the journey so far. We would like to thank our donors and to acknowledge the valuable work undertaken by local community groups and charities that inspires their giving. We extend our thanks to the increasing number of professional advisors who are engaging with The Foundation and are such important ambassadors for the growth of philanthropy in Ireland. Finally, we would like to particularly thank the Board members and staff at The Community Foundation for Ireland, without whom all that has been achieved since 2000 would simply not have been possible.

REFLECTIONS: 2000. The Community Foundation for Ireland was established in 2000. Early support came through grants from the Irish Government, The Atlantic Philanthropies and The Charles Stewart Mott Foundation.

REFLECTIONS: 2000-2003. In the first three years of The Community Foundation for Ireland, almost €0.75m was distributed in grants. The equivalent figure for the three years, 2008-2010, was six times greater at €4.5m.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Community Foundation for Ireland is believed to be the largest Irish independent, endowed grant-making organisation.

The Community Foundation is tackling social justice issues through donors' funds and energies, as well as through our staff's experience and expertise.

The Community Foundation for Ireland provides a channel for giving to Irish donors which is transparent, well managed and low in bureaucracy which helps them to donate in a strategic, planned and effective way.

The Community Foundation is developing a number of strategic funds, such as The Women's Fund, the Environmental Fund for Ireland, an Arts Fund and a LGBT Fund which will provide long-term and sustainable funding for key sectors in Irish society.

The Community Foundation is actively engaged in promoting greater philanthropy in Ireland through its work with professional advisors, publications and events, including the Philanthropist of the Year Awards.

The organisation has undertaken ground breaking research into legacies in Ireland, which are expected to be a significant driver of philanthropy in the future.

The Community Foundation can justifiably claim to be home to family philanthropy in Ireland with an ever increasing number of family funds.

The Community Foundation for Ireland is a leader in its sector, dedicated to achieving operational excellence and sustainability.

REFLECTIONS: 2004. The County Monaghan Fund was established and seeks to support local charities, communities and strategic initiatives for the long-term benefit of County Monaghan. This permanent fund has grown to over €350,000 and a number of local groups and charities are already benefitting.

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS - OVERVIEW OF FUNDS

Founded by businesses, NGO's, employer organisations and Government, The Community Foundation for Ireland received initial Government support of IR£1m. All subsequent funding has been raised independently of government. By the end of 2010, the total value of The Foundation's assets was almost €27m. The Fund is a tax-exempt fund and is held in trust by the Board of Directors of The Community Foundation for Ireland. The primary long term performance objective of the fund is to seek to maximise its overall return having regard to the performance of stock markets and taking due cognisance of the Fund's income requirements. Careful financial management has been a hallmark of The Community Foundation since its inception. The Community Foundation for Ireland also complies with the Statement of Guiding Principles for Fundraising.

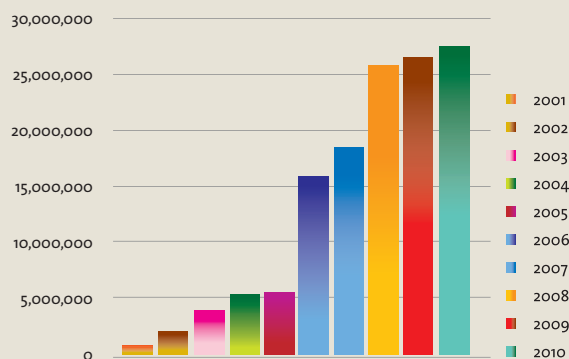
The Foundation typically operates funds which can be under the discretion of the Board or donor advised. Donors can make a donation to the Endowment Fund, to one of the Foundation's Thematic Funds (which to date include the Women's Fund, the LGBT Fund and the Environmental Fund for Ireland) or set up their own donor advised fund.

At 1st January 2010, the total value of the assets held by the Investment Manager on behalf of the Fund was €25,288,125. During the year, a further €728,367 representing donations received from donors for investment in the Fund was received. The Fund also received investment income during the year (including tax reclaimed) of €932,519. A total amount of €1,105,407 was made available to The Foundation to meet its grant-making requirements and to cover its administrative costs.

There was a capital appreciation of over €1m during 2010. The total value of assets at 31st December 2010 was €26,832,765. During 2010 an income return of 3.7% was achieved which exceeded the target set and enabled The Community Foundation to meet its grant making objectives for the year. The capital of the Fund also appreciated by 4.3%, which together with the capital appreciation of 6.5% achieved in 2009, has clawed back most of the fall experienced by the Fund's capital during the turmoil of global financial markets in 2008. The total return for the year, income and capital combined was therefore 8%.

As the graph illustrates, there has been a dramatic increase in the size of the endowment fund in recent years, from over €4m in 2003 to almost €27m by the end of 2010.

REFLECTIONS: 2005. The Endowment Fund has grown from €7.5m in 2005 to almost €27m in 2010, demonstrating the success of the community foundation model in growing a long-term philanthropic fund for the future.

REFLECTIONS ON GIVING

Mark FitzGerald, of Sherry FitzGerald, was recently named 2010 International Philanthropist of the Year for being the driving force behind the Amaweale project, through which 85 schools nationwide have been twinned with schools in South Africa over the last four years.

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS – OVERVIEW OF GRANT-MAKING

The Community Foundation provides an innovative mechanism for grant-making. The Foundation finds and links donors with causes and projects of interest to them.

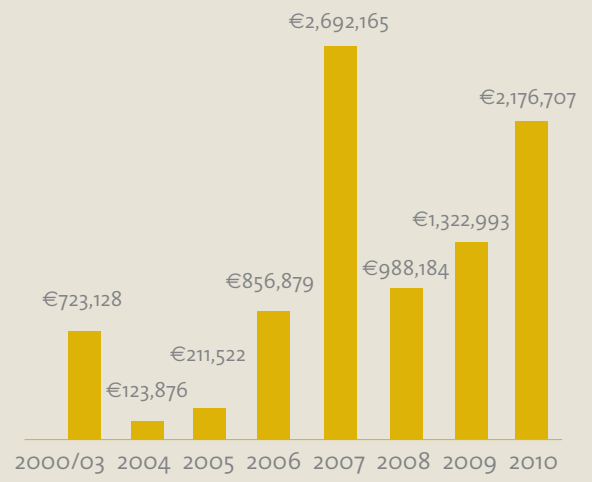
Grants are typically made in the following ways:

1. Grants from Donor-advised or Family Funds
2. Funds where the Board of The Community Foundation for Ireland has discretion over the grant-making. Grants are made from interest earned on donations that are pooled in the Endowment Fund for Ireland, e.g. The Grassroots Grants Programme, Impact Grants and the Ray Murphy Fund
3. Thematic Funds – such as The Women's Fund
4. Grants from corporate funds

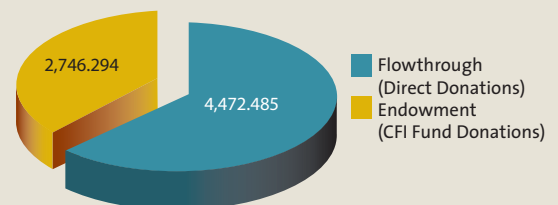

2010 HIGHLIGHTS

The Community Foundation for Ireland's Strategic Plan (2010-2012) identifies six priority areas. The following is a synopsis of key developments in each area during 2010:

1: Developing a culture of philanthropy in Ireland

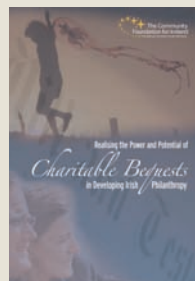
In 2010 The Community Foundation for Ireland played its part in helping to develop a culture of philanthropy in Ireland. This was the 4th year of The Community Foundation's Philanthropist of the Year Awards and the winners were:

- *Local Philanthropist of the Year* - Leslie Buckley for his philanthropic support of the Children's Cultural Centre The Ark
- *National Philanthropist of the Year* – U2 for their involvement in Music Generation, Ireland's National Music Education Programme
- *International Philanthropist of the Year* - Mark Fitzgerald for his work with Amawele, the South African Children's charity.



A particular highlight of 2010 was The Community Foundation for Ireland's groundbreaking work in relation to women's philanthropy. An initial symposium, organised by Philanthropy Ireland and The Community Foundation in April 2010 attracted a capacity

crowd and featured a closing address by The President, Mary McAleese. The Community Foundation launched the first Women's Fund in Ireland to coincide with the symposium. A follow up event in June was addressed by Dame Stephanie Shirley, the UK's Ambassador for Philanthropy. During 2010, Irish Tatler Magazine also ran a series of articles regarding women and philanthropy as part of its 10 year anniversary celebrations.



Another important development in 2010 was the Foundation's launch of new research on legacies in March. This is an area which has received little attention to date in an Irish context but which has great potential in expanding philanthropy in Ireland.

REFLECTIONS: 2008. The Community Foundation for Ireland launched the Ray Murphy Fund in remembrance of Ray Murphy, who played a pioneering role in the philanthropic sector and died in 2007. The Fund assists leaders and managers within the community and voluntary sectors in accessing reflective and innovative training.

2010 HIGHLIGHTS

The Community Foundation for Ireland continued to foster strategic partnerships with a number of other organisations including The Atlantic Philanthropies, Community Foundation Network – UK, The Community Foundation for Northern Ireland, Philanthropy Ireland, The Transatlantic Community Foundation Network, Trans Giving Europe and Business in the Community Ireland. The Foundation's Chief Executive is also a member of the Government's Philanthropy Forum, which launched its five point plan to promote philanthropy in Ireland in Government Buildings on June 22.

2: Generating new donor funds

The Foundation's Endowment Fund had grown to almost €27million by the end of 2010, a 12.65% increase in 12 months and a positive performance given the very difficult economic climate. By the year end, there were 50 funds, representing a broad mix of individuals, families, companies and charitable organisations who have chosen to entrust The Community Foundation for Ireland with their charitable giving.

In line with the Foundation's strategy to develop a number of thematic funds, the Women's Fund was successfully launched in 2010 and has already secured €225k endowment to date. An Environmental Fund for Ireland has also been set up and research was also undertaken during 2010 to consider the feasibility of establishing an Arts Fund and LGBT Communities Fund.



In partnership with the Mount Street Trust, a New Community Growers Fund was established to support the development of community gardens and allotments in the Dublin area.

The County Monaghan Fund continued its grant making in 2010 and supported a number of strategic initiatives, including a Scholarship Fund and a training Fund for the use of defibrillators in the county. A new Monaghan DVD was developed during 2010 to help generate revenue and publicity for the Fund. Towards the year end, the Foundation embarked on a new initiative to promote the roll out of new county funds.

3: Providing excellent services for donors

The Foundation takes its stewardship role of donors and funds very seriously and since its inception in 2000, the Foundation has adopted prudent investing and spending policies. The Foundation's endowment and donor base continues to grow notwithstanding the very difficult economic climate and weak financial markets. During 2010, the Foundation's Board and staff worked hard to ensure high satisfaction levels on the part of fund holders and donors by identifying great projects for them to support as well as providing opportunities for them to liaise with other donors.

REFLECTIONS: 2009. The Community Foundation responded quickly to the flooding crisis in many parts of Ireland. After an initial commitment of €50,000 by The Community Foundation, an additional €100,000 was contributed by a variety of individuals, family funds and companies.



4: The partner of choice for professional advisors

Community foundations around the world work closely with professional advisors including lawyers, tax advisors, accountants and wealth managers. In 2010, The Community Foundation for Ireland continued to prioritise

this area, greatly assisted by its Professional Advisors Advisory Group. A new look newsletter was developed and distributed to 2,300 professional advisors. Over 40 meetings were held with individual advisors. The Foundation had ongoing contacts with a number of professional bodies regarding the systematic introduction of philanthropy into the curriculum of relevant courses and also made presentations to law students in UCD and Trinity College. During the course of the year a number of seminars were held including a Family Philanthropy Seminar with US expert, Ellen Remmer in April.

5: Impacting on social issues through effective grant-making

Grant-making is at the heart of the Community Foundation for Ireland's activities and is dependent on the sterling work of local community groups and charities throughout Ireland, many of whom are struggling during these recessionary times. Over 700 grants, totalling in excess of €2.175m, were made in support of community groups and charitable organisations in 2010.

The Foundation continued to operate its successful Grassroots Grants in support of smaller organisations with a turnover of €250k or less and addressing issues such as families at risk, older people, ethnic minorities, carers and mental health. New programmes also came on stream, including The Women's Fund (and huge interest was shown in its first grant round), support for LGBT Communities and community gardens and allotments.



During 2010 the Flood Recovery Fund was spent down. This Fund had been raised in response to the severe floods of 2009 and demonstrated the flexibility of the Foundation which was able to give

much needed support to local community groups, as well as funding towards research into flood avoidance in the future.

6: Maintaining operational excellence and being self-sustaining

Integrity is a core value of The Community Foundation for Ireland in terms of being accountable for what we do and transparent in how we do it. Strong governance is essential to those who entrust their funds to our stewardship. During 2010, The Foundation continued to strive to demonstrate value for money and best practice in all our areas of activity.
