*Connecting people who care with causes that matter* – the motto of The Community Foundation for Ireland resonated strongly in 2012, another difficult year for many communities and non profit organisations. The Foundation worked hard to connect a growing number of donors with worthwhile causes and to continue to grow sustainable long term funds for The Foundation. Through the generosity of donors and through income from its long term endowed fund, The Community Foundation for Ireland distributed over €2.4m through a wide range of grants. By the year end, cumulative grant-making by The Community Foundation for Ireland surpassed €13m since its establishment in 2000 and over €6m in the past three years alone. Positively, The Foundation's Endowment Fund increased in value from €26.8 million at the end of 2011 to €28.7 million by the end of 2012, based on new donations to the Fund and good capital appreciation.

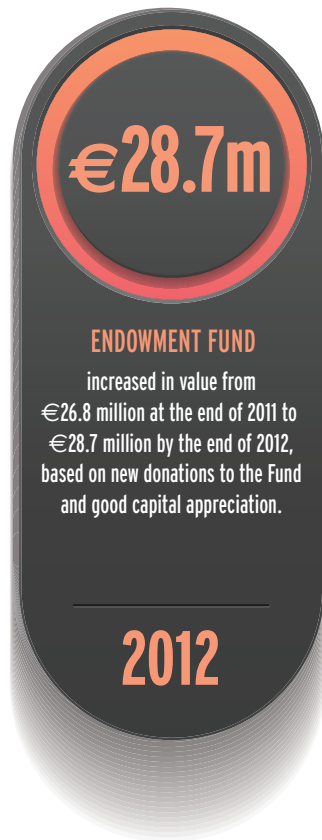
The death of Brian Wilson, former Chairman of The Community Foundation for Ireland, in November 2011 was a source of great sadness on the part of the Board and staff of The Community Foundation for Ireland. Brian was a wonderful supporter of The Foundation over many years and, as Chairman, provided wise counsel and insights in navigating The Foundation through the turbulence and challenges of the economic downturn.

Unfortunately, economic recession continued unabated in Ireland in 2012 and in an environment of declining public resources, community and voluntary groups remained under severe pressure to make ends meet. An additional challenge for the sector was the imminent closure of The Atlantic Philanthropies and the One Foundation. Mindful of this challenging external environment, The Foundation undertook a radical review of its own strategy which included extensive consultation with its stakeholders, including non profit sector leaders, other charitable trusts and foundations and grantees. This resulted in the adoption of a new three year strategy for 2013-2015 and the launch of '*Caring Communities*' as its new flagship grants programme towards the year end.

plans were at an advanced stage to establish a new Older People's Fund within The Community Foundation for Ireland.

Highlights of the year included a Grantee Consultation event in October, a launch event for the 2011 Annual Report in the National Concert Hall in July, a number of Women's Fund Seeing is Believing Tours and the 5th Philanthropist of the Year Awards in December. By the year end, work was also at an advanced stage in relation to the publication of the first VitalSigns Report in Europe – a report card on the vitality of the nation.

The Foundation continues to play its part in promoting greater philanthropy in Ireland through its on going work with professional advisors and through publications and events, including the Philanthropist of the Year Awards. The Foundation welcomed the Government's endorsement of the recommendations of the Forum on Philanthropy and Fundraising in July and looks forward to supporting The One Percent Difference Campaign in 2013.



A number of new funds came on board during 2012, including five family funds; a strategic priority for the Foundation. There was a particular surge in activity amongst existing and new donors towards the year end which may have been linked to changes in the tax regime governing charitable donations in the 2012 Budget. The Women's Fund continued to grow and towards the end of the year,

## 2012 HIGHLIGHTS

**The Community Foundation for Ireland's Strategic Plan (2010-2012) identifies six priority areas. The following is a synopsis of key developments in each area in 2012:**

### **1: Developing a culture of philanthropy in Ireland**

The Community Foundation for Ireland continued to play its part in helping to develop a culture of philanthropy in Ireland throughout 2012. The Foundation welcomed the Government's endorsement of the recommendations of the Forum on Philanthropy and Fundraising (of which The Foundation's Chief Executive is a member) in July. The effective implementation of the recommendations including the establishment of the Social Innovation Fund, building fundraising capacity and in particular, the forthcoming National Giving Campaign provide the opportunity to encourage more, and much needed, philanthropy in Ireland. Although much delayed, attention was finally given to implementing some key provisions of the 2009 Charities Act in 2012 which was also welcomed by The Foundation.

The Foundation hosted a number of promotional events during 2012 including a launch event for the 2011 Annual Report in the National Concert Hall in July (providing a number of "insights" into the Foundation's work with donors, non-profit organisations and other trusts and foundations), several Women's Fund Seeing is Believing Tours and

the Philanthropist of The Year Awards. By the year end, work was also at an advanced stage to publish VitalSigns - a report card on how Ireland is doing in relation to 12 key issue areas affecting the quality of life of those who live, work, play and learn in Ireland. VitalSigns first started in Canada and is increasingly being used by community foundations throughout the world to inform their work in targeting grant-making to the areas where it can achieve most impact and in providing guidance to their donors.

The Community Foundation for Ireland continued to foster strategic partnerships with a number of other organisations including The Atlantic Philanthropies, the Katharine Howard Foundation, Business in the Community Ireland, Community Foundation Network – UK, The Community Foundation for Northern Ireland, Philanthropy Ireland, The Transatlantic Community Foundation Network and Trans Giving Europe.

### **2: Generating new donor funds**

The Foundation's Endowment Fund increased from €26.8 million at the end of 2011 to €28.7 million by the end of 2012, based on donations to the Fund and good capital appreciation. By the year end, there were over 50 donor advised funds, representing a broad mix of individuals, families, companies and charitable organisations which have chosen to entrust The Community Foundation for Ireland with their charitable giving.

The promotion of greater family philanthropy in Ireland remained a central priority. Five new family funds were established in 2012 and a substantial family fund was under development at the year end.

Following its high profile launch in 2010, The Community Foundation for Ireland continued to promote The Women's Fund, with considerable

support from its Steering Committee and Ambassadors. Work also continued around the feasibility of establishing additional thematic funds and by the year end, plans were underway to launch an Older People's Fund.

The County Monaghan Fund continued its grant making in 2012 and supported a number of initiatives, including continuing support for scholarships through the DCU Educational Trust and the County Monaghan Secondary Schools Art Competition. The Fund has also continued to distribute its document promoting



legacy giving to the County Monaghan Fund to all solicitors and accountants throughout the county.

A growing dimension to The Community Foundation's work is collaborating with charitable trusts and foundations and other partners to administer funds on their behalf, drawing on the Foundation's expertise in grant-making at a grass-roots level. During 2012, The Foundation continued to collaborate with ESB and Galetch Energy in relation to the Mountainlodge Community Fund in Cavan, The Mount Street Club Trust in relation to The Community Growers Fund and the OLC Trust Fund in relation to its fund to assist vulnerable women.



## 2012 HIGHLIGHTS



### 3: Providing excellent services for donors

The Foundation takes its stewardship role of donors and their funds very seriously and since its inception in 2000, The Foundation has adopted prudent investing and spending policies. The Foundation has a donor charter which is updated annually. During 2012, The Foundation's Board and staff worked hard to ensure high satisfaction levels on the part of fund holders and donors.



Informed by encouraging feedback from a survey of donors in late 2011 and best practise internationally, a Donor Care policy was developed during the year and its implementation will be a key priority for The Foundation in 2013.

### 4: The partner of choice for professional advisors

Community foundations around the world work closely with professional advisors including solicitors, tax advisors, accountants and wealth managers. The Community Foundation for Ireland continued to prioritise this area in 2012, greatly assisted by its Professional Advisors Advisory Group which welcomed a number of new members. Four meetings of the group took place and six newsletters were circulated to a wide audience of professional advisors throughout Ireland. There was much work under-taken over the

last two years with professional bodies in terms of moving towards the introduction of philanthropy onto their training modules and continuous professional development (CPD) programs. 2012 saw The Irish Tax Institute introduce philanthropy onto one of its training modules for the first time. It is expected others will follow on shortly. In response to the Department of Finance public consultation process on proposed amendments to the S.848A Tax Relief Scheme for Charitable Donations, The Community Foundation for Ireland and ICTR together organised a well-received professional advisor briefing. There was a series of meetings with professional advisors on a one-to-one basis, as well as presentations to departments within firms.







### 5: Impacting on social issues through effective grant-making

2012 was the final year of The Community Foundation for Ireland's Grassroots Grants addressing issues such as families at risk, older people, ethnic minorities, carers and mental health and 340 grants totalling in excess of €460,000 were distributed through this scheme alone. Two Women's Fund Grant Rounds were greatly oversubscribed, demonstrating the case for a strong Women's Fund to support areas such as the prevention of violence against women and empowering women to take leadership roles in their communities. 2012 was the final year of The LGBT Communities Fund, co funded by The Atlantic

Philanthropies. The Community Growers Fund supported over twenty individual gardening projects and 10 projects were supported under the Jump Start programme to engage older men in physical activity. The Foundation also made more than twenty larger impact grants, which included supporting the work of the 50:50 Group, Women for Election, Marriage Equality, Age and Opportunity, the Immigrant Council of Ireland, the Yellow Flag Programme and the Irish Network Against Racism (ENAR Ireland).

Through the generosity of donors, a wide range of individual grants were also made to many non profit organisations and projects throughout Ireland, as well as to overseas charities.



### 6: Maintaining operational excellence and being self-sustaining

Integrity is a core value of The Community Foundation for Ireland in terms of being accountable for what we do and transparent in how we do it, with strong governance for those who entrust their funds to our stewardship. During 2012, The Foundation continued to strive to demonstrate value for money and best practice in all our areas of activity.

## SUPPORTING DONORS

The Community Foundation for Ireland is a one stop shop for donors engaged in strategic and purposeful philanthropy. The Foundation ensures that our donors' charitable donations support the causes which they care most about and achieve real impact in communities throughout Ireland and overseas.

A great strength of a community foundation is that it is flexible and responsive to individual donor's needs. The Community Foundation for Ireland works with individuals, families, corporates and other organisations who wish to have the independence and control which comes from having their own donor advised fund, coupled with the services which the Foundation provides to its donors.

The Community Foundation for Ireland was delighted to welcome a number of new donors on board during 2012, including some of the donors who are profiled below.

One of these is a business woman who was looking to engage her 15 year old son in philanthropy during his Transition Year. They identified some areas which they were interested in supporting, including education and The Community Foundation presented them with a menu of opportunities which met their criteria. They decided to support a number of projects, including a significant grant in support of Time to Read, a successful literacy programme developed by the Schools Business Partnership within Business in the Community.

Another donor made contact with The Foundation having read *Philanthropy Matters*, The Community Foundation for Ireland's newsletter. He and his wife had been thinking of setting up a family fund for some time as they saw it as a way to involve their adult children and to give together as a family. They have now set up a donor advised fund which is named after his mother. Another family fund has been set up by a donor who was referred to The Community Foundation for Ireland by his professional advisor. He was delighted to find out that the facility of a donor advised fund existed in Ireland. He too has an interest in supporting education and is exploring a number of projects with support from The Community Foundation for Ireland.

At Christmas, which is always a popular time for charitable giving, another new donor got in contact with The Community Foundation for Ireland. He has set up a donor advised fund through allocating the Director's fees which he earns as a Non-Executive Director of a public company and which he has decided to give back to the community.

In all these cases, the donor was able to concentrate on giving and The Community Foundation for Ireland handled all other aspects of their philanthropy, including due diligence, administration and governance, as well as providing strategic advice and support so that their giving is rewarding and impactful.

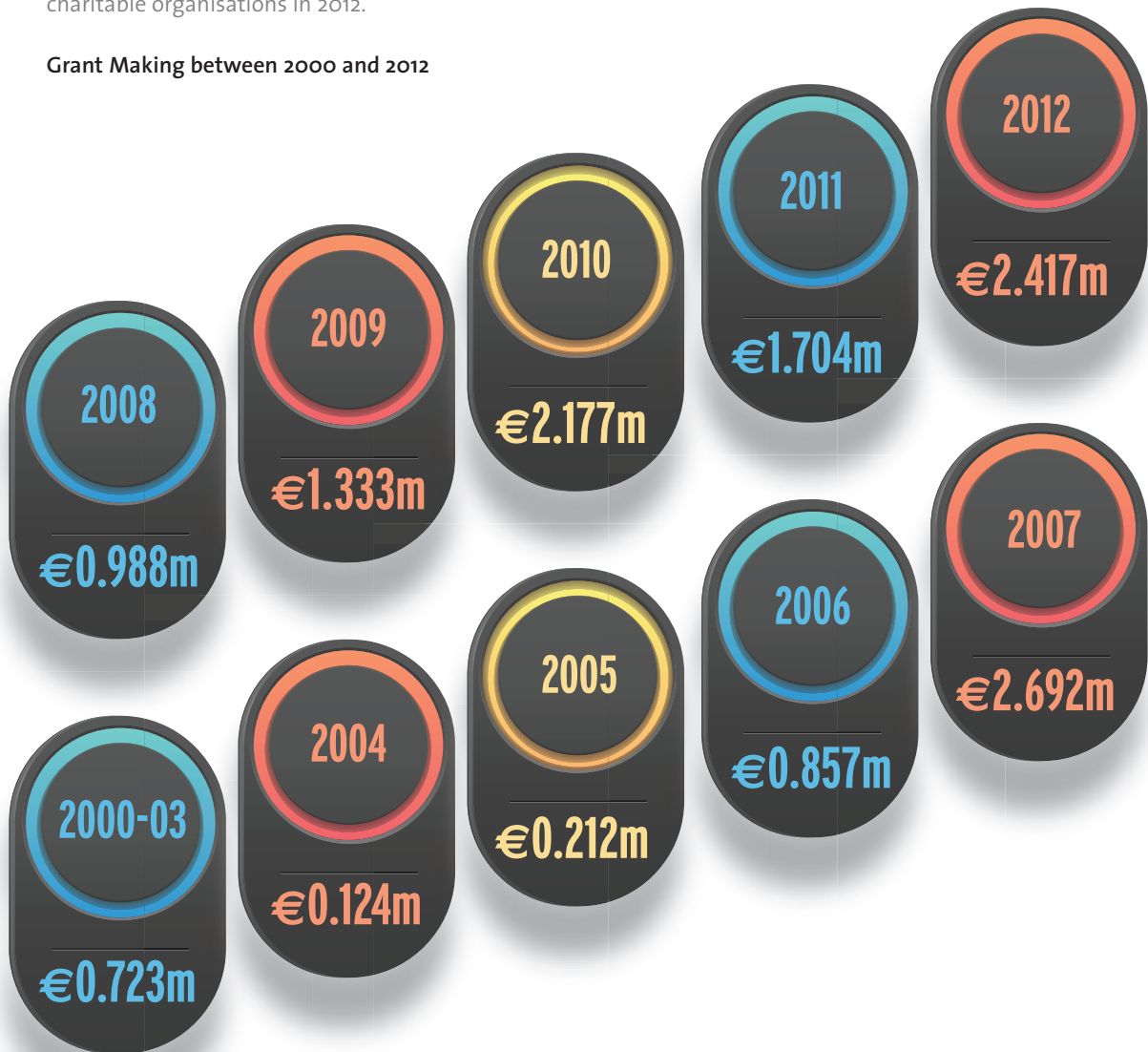

Over 800 grants totalling in excess of €2.4m were made in support of community groups and charitable organisations in 2012.

## CELEBRATING PHILANTHROPY



In July 2012, the Government endorsed the recommendations of The Forum on Philanthropy and Fundraising to meet the target of increasing philanthropic giving by ten per cent year on year in Ireland from its current level of approximately €500m per annum to €800m by 2016. The Forum (of which The Foundation's CEO is a member) has highlighted that while Ireland has a "proud tradition of giving", planned and purposeful charitable giving has tended to

be weak with only 15% of people donating in a regular planned way.

The community foundation model has developed over the past one hundred years in cities and countries throughout the world as a successful means of revitalising local communities and providing an easy to access and effective way for people to engage in philanthropy. Although still relatively new in Ireland, the steady growth of The Community Foundation for Ireland since it was established in 2000 demonstrates that there is a potential to grow philanthropy further in Ireland. The Community Foundation for Ireland is playing its part in promoting greater philanthropy in Ireland through a number of initiatives and events which in 2012 included the fifth Philanthropist of the Year Awards in December and a promotional event in The National Concert Hall in July. The Foundation is also planning a number of initiatives in support of The One Percent Difference Campaign which commences in 2013.

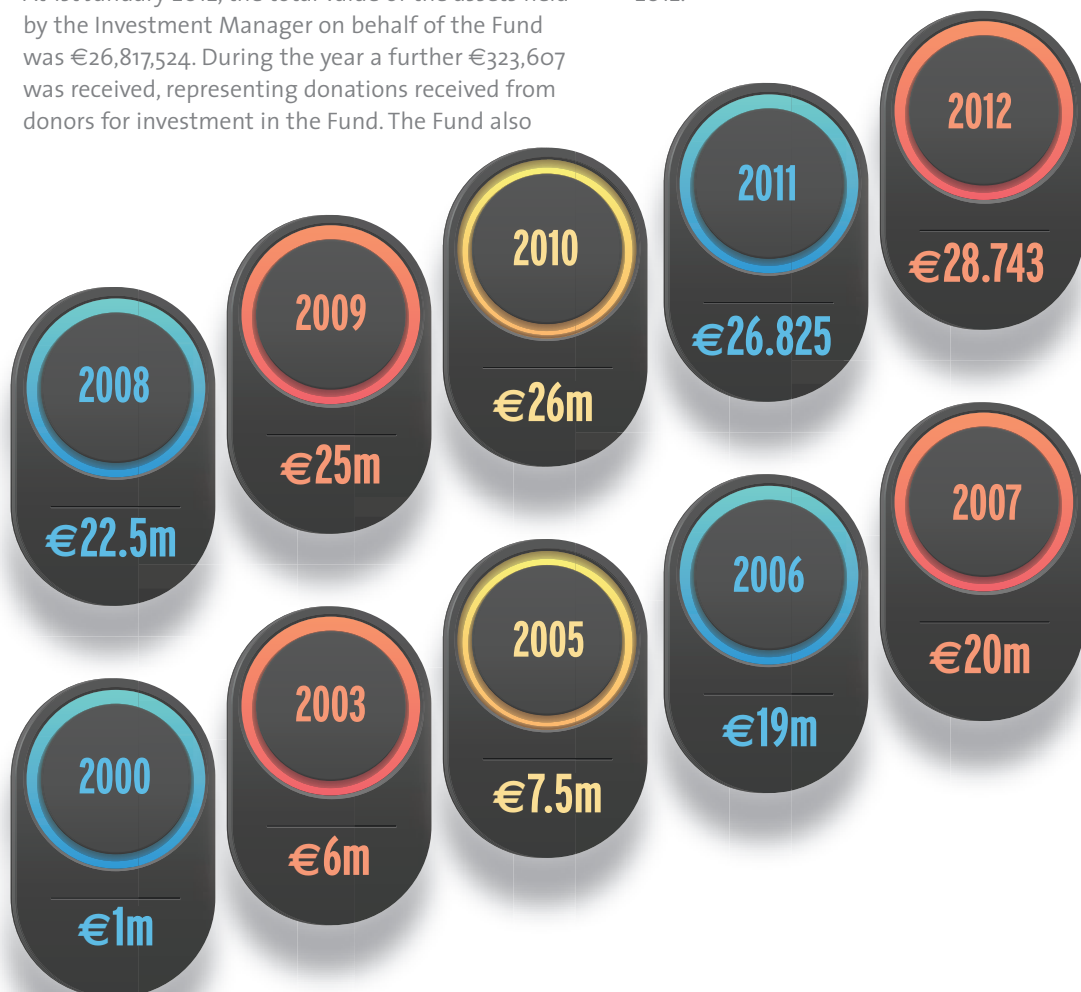
## FUND MANAGEMENT 2012

The total value of the assets held by the Manager on behalf of the Fund at 31st December 2012 was €28,743,149. The Fund is a tax-exempt fund and is held in trust by the Board of Directors of The Community Foundation for Ireland. The primary long term performance objective of the fund is to maximise its overall return having regard to the performance of stock markets and taking due cognisance of the Fund's income requirements. Careful financial management has been a hallmark of The Community Foundation since its inception. The Community Foundation for Ireland also complies with the Statement of Guiding Principles for Fundraising.

At 1st January 2012, the total value of the assets held by the Investment Manager on behalf of the Fund was €26,817,524. During the year a further €323,607 was received, representing donations received from donors for investment in the Fund. The Fund also

received investment income during the year (including tax reclaimed) of €1,040,492. A total amount of €1,427,828 was made available to The Foundation to meet its grant making requirements and to cover its administrative costs. A further €111,987 was deducted to meet the Investment Manager's fees and other investment expenses. During the year, the fund achieved a total capital appreciation of €2,101,341 (realised gains €197,083, unrealised gains €1,904,258).

As the graphic illustrates, there has been a steady increase in the size of The Community Foundation for Ireland's endowment fund in the past twelve years, from €1m in 2000 to over €28.7 by the end of 2012.
